## **Disaster Supplies Kit**

After a disaster, local official and relief workers will be on the scene, but they cannot reach everyone immediately. Your family will cope best by preparing for a disaster *before* it strikes. One way to prepare is by assembling a Disaster Supplies Kit. When a disaster hits, you don't have time to shop or search for supplies, but if you have gathered them in advance your family can endure an evacuation or home confinement.

When preparing for a possible emergency situation, it's best to think first about the basics of survival: **fresh water**, **food**, **clean air and warmth**. Every family should have a portable Family Disaster Supply Kit which can be taken to your shelter area or brought with you in the event of an evacuation. Each family or individual's kit should be customized to meet specific needs, such as medications and infant formula. It should also be customized to include important family documents.

## **Recommended Supplies to Include in a Portable Kit**

□ <b>Water</b> , amounts for portable kits will vary. Individuals should determine what amount they are
